National Jute Board [NJB] invites EoI from the Consultancy Agencies / Institutions of repute and with good financial standing for assessing the Socio-Economic condition of the Jute Mill workers & their family members. Agencies intending to participate in the process may download the EoI document from <http://www.jute.com>. EoI may be submitted in a three-packet bid system in the above address before 1:00 PM on 24th June 2015. The bids received after due date / incomplete / without requisite documents shall be summarily rejected. NJB reserves the rights to reject any or all the bids without assigning any reason thereof.

1. Objective of the exercise

Jute industry has occupied a major place in the industrial economy of India. There are 91 composite jute mills distributed in eight states of the country, out of which 67 mills are located within West Bengal. Based on the latest data received from 67 of these mills there are around 1.3 lakh permanent workers and nearly 81 thousand other workers in these mills. If all the mills are taken in to account, then the actual number of workers will be much more. Being a labour intensive industry, its profitability and sustainability are closely related to the quality and productivity of the workers and their well-being. The Ministry of Textiles, Government of India has recently taken several welfare measures for the employees of the jute mills and their dependent members in the family. An enquiry into the socio-economic conditions of the workers will be highly useful for understanding the socioeconomic condition of the labour force and to make appropriate policy decisions aimed at taking further welfare measures as well as in improving their productivity. In this context, The Jute Commissioner desires to conduct a study to find out the socioeconomic conditions of the jute mill workers.

The study is intended to provide a comprehensive knowledge about the socioeconomic status of the jute mill workers and their dependents and their access to the basic civic services, other socioeconomic services and the benefit they are deriving from different schemes of the Union and the State Governments. The study will also identify the constraints they are facing in improving their quality of life within the given social and economic context in which they are living at present. The study should bring out the areas of possible improvement by proper utilization of existing government schemes and further interventions so that their quality of life could be improved.

National Jute Board and the O/o the Jute Commissioner will extend possible assistance to the selected agency to have access to the mills and the residential colonies for conducting the study.

2. Terms of Reference for Socio-Economic Survey

The study will be conducted to assess the current socio-economic condition of jute mill workers in India. In the first phase the study will be conducted for the jute mills located within West Bengal.

The points to be explored are ---

1. Demographic aspects and present living condition of the jute mill workers and their family members.
2. Access to various economic & social services and civic amenities by the workers and their family members. Special coverage would be given to nutritional status, hygiene, sanitation, access to primary & higher education, Anganwadi Centres, social, economic, health and other services provided by the Government.
3. Sources of income and alternate modes of income of family members.
4. Category – SC / ST / OBC / Minority etc.

5. Age groups, migrated state, availability of power, water supply, internet, mobile etc.
6. Bank A/cs, Aadhar enrollment, religion, availability of mid-day meal, study materials, play grounds, schools, cooking [LPG], etc.
7. Additional income, if any, of their dependent family members.
8. Asset ownership of the workers.
9. Extent of migration, absenteeism and related issues.
10. Various social and environmental problems being faced by the workers and their family members.
11. The possible interventions for improvement of the socio-economic status of the jute mill workers and improving performance of the workers.

The agency should submit the study design and detailed methodology to be adopted while conducting the study. It should clearly delineate the socio-economic parameters including the access to various services which are going to be considered to get a clear picture of current living condition of the workers and constraints they are facing in accessing those services.

3. Eligibility Criteria for selection

The agency should be a reputed Consultancy Agency / Institutions having sound financial standing with at least five years of experience of working in social sector. The study shall require knowledge of various government programmes which may benefit the jute mill workers and their family members. The agency should have sound knowledge of the relevant programmes and experience of monitoring and evaluation in the field of poverty alleviation, rural & urban development, health & nutrition, education, water & sanitation etc.

4. Method of Selection

Based on the technical proposal, the proposal of only those bidders will be considered who have sound knowledge in the given field. The overall assessment will be based on quality of the technical proposal and the rationality of the proposed financial budget. Lower financial budget may not necessarily attract the selection. Scoring pattern for selection of the agency will be-

Final Score = 80% * Technical Score + 20% * Financial Score

5. Deliverables and Timeline

The agency will submit the following to the Jute Commissioner :

1. **Inception report** -The report will contain the final methodology, tools, data analysis plan, list of stakeholders to be covered and the timeline. The inception report shall also describe the quality control mechanism. The report is expected to be submitted within one month from issue the issue of Letter of Intent to the agency. In case, there is some comment by the Jute Commissioner, the same should be incorporated in the methodology.
2. **Draft report** - On acceptance of the Inception Report with or without comment, the agency will initiate the study and submit the draft report within four months after submission of the said report.
3. **Final report** - The final report should be submitted within one month from receiving feedback from the Jute Commissioner on the draft report. A soft copy along with two hard copies is to be submitted.

6. Mode of payment

The payment will be made as per the following schedule:

- i. Acceptance of the Inception Report - 20% of the total amount of the contract
- ii. Submission of the Draft Report - 20% of the total amount of the contract
- iii. Submission of the Final Report - 60% of the total amount of the contract

7. Terms and conditions

National Jute Board reserves the right, without any obligation or liability, to accept or reject any or all the EOIs at any stage of the process, to cancel or modify the process or any part thereof, or to modify any of the terms and conditions at any time, without assigning any reasons whatsoever. Selection will be based on the technical credential of the applicant institution as well as the rationality of the proposed financial budget. Lower financial budget may not necessarily attract the selection. Responses received after the stipulated time period or not in accordance with the specified format will be summarily rejected. Submission of the bid along with necessary documents at the given address will be the sole responsibility of the responding agency. The responding agency shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the proposal. National Jute Board will, in no case, be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the solicitation. The proposal shall remain valid for 90 days from the date of submission or acceptance of the proposal, whichever is earlier. No data collected during this project work can be published or utilized in other work without prior approval of the National Jute Board.

Financial bids of bidders qualified in technical bid will only be opened. Financial bids of the bidders failing to qualify in Technical bid will not be opened.

Full marks: **20 Marks**. Bidder with the lowest quote will get the full marks. The marks of the higher quote will be awarded inversely proportionate marks i.e., the lowest bidder (F1) will be given the maximum marks out of 20 and other bids (n, n1, n2, etc.) will be marked according to the formula " **$F1/n \times 20$** ".

9. Evaluation of the Bid

After the evaluation of Eligibility criteria and Technical competence, NJB will intimate the agencies whose proposals did not meet the minimum qualifying mark indicating that their financial proposals will not be opened.

NJB will simultaneously intimate those agencies those have secured the minimum qualifying mark, and Indicate the date and time set for opening the financial proposals. The financial proposals will be opened in the presence of representatives of the agencies.

The names of the agencies and the offered prices will be read aloud and recorded when the financial proposals are opened, and a copy of this record will be retained.

Marks obtained in both Technical and Financial bids will be added for preparation of a list of panel. Bidder who secured highest score will be considered as L1 and so on.

Agency considered as L1 would be awarded the job subject to approval of competent authority.

10. Last date for submission of Expression of Interest and opening of Bid :

NJB will appoint Bid Opening Committee and Technical Evaluation Committee members.

The last date of submission of the bids is 24th June 2015 till 1:00 PM.

The bids will be opened on the same day at 4:00 PM. Only Packet 'A' will be opened on that day for ascertaining the eligibility to participate in the bid. The dates of opening of Packet 'B' & 'C' will be intimated in due course.
